At our September 19th general meeting Amanda Molson, the DC Historic Preservation Office's (DCHPO) representative for the Foxhall Village Historic District, will be on hand to address questions about renovations within the historic district. This presentation comes in the wake of a number of violations that have resulted in large fines to owners and the necessity to redo renovations at the owner's expense.

Ms. Molson will review types of projects which require permits, the process for obtaining proper permits, as well as the "Foxhall Village Design Guidelines," a booklet put together by the DCHPO (and the FCCA) which lays out regulations and procedures for our historic district. ### Thefts from Autos

One of the most common types of theft is theft of valuables from your automobile. Theft from auto is strictly a crime of opportunity that can be prevented if you take away the opportunity. Thieves generally don't waste time breaking into cars that don't have valuables in plain sight.

Please take the precautions listed below to help ensure your auto is not targeted by thieves:

Keep Your Valuables Out of Sight
The best way to prevent theft from
your auto is to always keep valuables
out of sight. Never leave cell phones,
briefcases, suitcases, or electronic
devices (cell phones, iPods, laptop
computers, etc.) in plain view. Take
these items with you, or secure
them—all the time, every time.

Secure Your GPS Device
While many GPS devices are mounted in the dashboard of the vehicle, the police department encourages anyone who uses a portable GPS device to take it with you when you park the car.

#### Use Your Trunk

If your car has a trunk, use it or utilize a locked glove compartment. Hiding items under seats is better than leaving them in plain view, but securing them inside the glove compartment or trunk is a far better deterrent.

Don't Tempt Thieves with New Purchases

During the holiday season especially, or any time you're shopping, place packages in the trunk.

Remove Your Radio Faceplate
If you can unfasten your sound system
and take it with you, or lock it in your
trunk, do so. And don't forget to do
the same with your CDs and tapes.

Lock It Up

Also, keep your car doors and windows locked—all the time!

# Notes from June (06/20/12) FCCA Meeting

FCCA Board Member, Conrad DeWitte, chaired the meeting.

Officer Anthony McElwee (anthony.mcelwee@dc.gov), 2nd District, reported that crime in our area is down 50% from this time last year. The major problem appears to be thefts inside the home by a known person, e.g. a contractor. Officer McElwee also cautioned to keep vehicles locked with valuables out of sight.

Discussion then centered on the main topic of the evening, the Proposed Revised Georgetown University Campus Plan, if approved, would be in effect until 12/31/17. Conrad DeWitte introduced guests who included Ron Lewis, ANC 2E chair, and three representatives from Georgetown University. The key elements of the plan were:

Formation of a new collegial partnership of senior GU leadership and community representatives – the Georgetown Community Partnership – to work toward making the Campus Plan a success and to work together on planning for the future. Community members would include representatives from community organizations in Georgetown, Burleith, Foxhall, as well as ANC2E and ANC3D.

450 more undergraduates will be housed on campus at the Leavey Center and other on campus locations by Fall 2015.

Undergraduate enrollment will remain at a maximum of 6,675 and total enrollment at the main campus over

the Campus Plan period to be a maximum of 14,106 students.

New emphasis on a living and learning campus that centralizes student social life on campus maintaining the peaceful, quiet atmosphere of our residential neighborhoods.

A new commitment to explore providing University-sponsored graduate student housing outside the Georgetown, Burleith, and Foxhall (all of FCCA area, not just Foxhall Village) communities.

Acknowledgement of long-term goals of the community and GU for the future, including a new satellite campus for Continuing Education Students of up to 100 acres located elsewhere; cooperating in developing and implementing a 20 year campus plan following the success of the 2011-2017 plan; and the mutual goal of "a collegial and harmonious relationship between the University and the community to address future plans and common issues in an effective, creative and lasting way"

The proposed agreement was presented to FCCA members for a vote and approved.
