Did you know that many of your FCCA Neighbors are volunteering for Palisades Village? This local organization helps people stay in their homes as long as possible by providing volunteer services, information on reliable service providers, social and cultural events, etc.

Three of our neighbors serve on the Palisades Village Board: Tom DeMuth, MaryAnn Griffin and Arne Paulson. Past Board members include Alicia Juarrero and Charles Lanman. In addition, many in our community provide volunteer services such as driving Palisades Village members to doctor and therapy appointments, grocery shopping, routine household chores, etc. Younger members of the community have provided services such as leaf raking, yard clean up, making holiday and birthday cards and even delivering cookies. The community bodies that have organized these student volunteers include Key School, St. Patrick's, Georgetown Day, Lab School and Boy Scout Troup 61. There are more than two dozen households in the FCCA area that are either Palisades Village members, volunteers, or both.

### Who is responsible for clearing sidewalks?

District law requires property owners to clear snow and ice from sidewalks, handicap ramps and steps abutting their property within the first 8 daylight hours after snow, sleet or ice stop falling. (DC Code, 2001 Ed., § 9-601.)

This applies to all property owners residential, commercial, federal, and municipal. If ice cannot be cleared without damaging the sidewalk, then property owners may spread sand or salt to make the sidewalks safe. (DC Code, 2001 Ed., § 9-604.)

Property owners must also clear snow from the ADA-curb ramps. These are part of the sidewalk. Property owners are also asked to clear snow from catch basins and storm drains to prevent flooding during snow melt.

If you rent a single-family home or your lease states that you, not your landlord, are responsible for clearing the snow, then you can be cited as well. Be sure to call your landlord or review your lease terms if you are not sure.

Is there a fine for not clearing the sidewalk? Yes. According to DC municipal Code, if property owners fail to comply, and if the District must clear their sidewalk (DC Code, 2001 Ed., § 9-605) the property owners will be sued for the cost of clearing the snow or ice plus a \$25 fine (DC Code, 2001 Ed., § 9-606).

#### Crime Report, Year in Review

Looking back over the year we have been fairly blessed with a low crime rate in our area. Mallory Lawson, our Neighborhood Watch Coordinator, has been terrific in obtaining crime reports for all of the MPD Second District, an area that goes well beyond our borders but keeps us in tune with what is happening in general. Many of the things that are happening in surrounding areas have been absent within FCCA. This is potentially because of our heightened sense of security but also there is some luck involved.

Everyone should continue to make sure you lock your doors, and make use of outdoor lighting at night. Lock your car and don't leave valuables inside. Don't leave bicycles, tools and other valuables outside. If you are away, make sure your neighbors are keeping an eve on your home and picking up packages, mail, newspapers, and advertisements that are left outside your home. If you are away, make use of timers on lights within your home. It is an unfortunate fact that the more successful crime is in a neighborhood, the more criminals will come back for more. Something newer in crime: thieves are now breaking into cars to steal airbags.

#### **Help Wanted!**

The FCCA is looking for a part-time administrator who lives in the FCCA membership area. #### FCCA Meeting Minutes, 11/20/13

Officer Tony McElwee gave the crime report. Crime went up about 44% in our area this year. As of late November, there were 23 crimes committed. Auto theft continues to be the number one crime, particularly among unlocked autos. There were three burglaries while people were not at home. Residents are encouraged to email Officer McElwee (Anthony.mcelwee@dc.gov) when they are on vacation, and he will periodically drive by the vacationer's house to check on it.

Mr. Klaus Trudel from the German Embassy reported on the construction at the embassy. This project began in 2010, and completion for the construction should be in early 2014. Employees hope to move back into the embassy in July, 2014.

Bob Avery, FCCA President, mentioned that an ANC meeting is planned for 12/10/13, to hear plans by the Lab School to build a new high school on their Reservoir Rd. campus. This issue was discussed at a 01/14 BZA meeting. Part of the plan includes the elimination of 21 parking spaces currently available on the Lab School campus. In addition, the requested lease extension for the Lab School (Hardy Campus) is still under consideration by the DC City Council.

Election for the FCCA Board of Directors was held. All current Board members were reelected. A request was made seeking representation for the area of MacArthur Blvd. from the Georgetown Day School down to Canal Road. Anyone interested should contact Bob Avery.

The remainder of the meeting was dedicated to a discussion of plans to renovate the MacArthur Boulevard Safeway. Ms. Renee Montgomery (renee.montgomery@pdcenters.com) from Safeway, and other representatives associated with Safeway, presented plans for a major renovation that includes the addition of 70 to 100 condominium units to be built above the new planned Safeway, as well as the construction of four free standing houses. Parking will be underground. Neighbors are encouraged to check the website of the Palisades Citizens' Association (www.palisadesdc.org) for a very complete reporting on this issue. Safeway is hoping to approach the DC Zoning Commission within the next six months, and they hope to begin construction in the middle of 2015.

#### **GU UPDATE**

The FCCA have been working with neighbors in Burleith and Georgetown along with Georgetown University through an organization named the Georgetown Community Partnership (GCP) to implement the 2010 to 2017 Georgetown University campus plan, and to provide input into Georgetown University master planning efforts. 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#### **Real Estate Corner**

The Washington DC single-family sales market in 2013 was noticeably improved over 2012 with more settlements and higher prices. Tight inventory continued to push up price appreciation rates through 2013 and will likely do so through the spring. It was interesting to see that 2013 inventory continued to be lower to that of the previous year, month on month, until October 2013, and since then continuing to be slightly higher. Indications are that the current market and the spring market will give a slight advantage to sellers and should help pump up the number of listings. Below are the 2013 sales figures within the FCCA boundary. Sales data was obtained from MRIS.

Additionally, there were 12 properties that sold in the new Foxhall Ridge development on the south side of 4400 block Macarthur Blvd. These sold between \$976,100 and \$1,949,990. Everyone should look for their notice from DC Office of Tax and Revenue for their 2015 property tax assessment to see if DC Government has noticed your increased value as well. The assessment notice is the estimated market value of your property. It is the basis for the calculation of your tax bill. If you are unhappy with the appraisal, you must file your appeal within 30 days of the date of your assessment notice. The statutory deadline for filing appeals is April 1. Shortly after you receive your assessment you should receive your semiannual real estate tax bill. The real estate tax year goes from 1 October to 30 September.
