


Call Box Restoration Project Update

We have made good progress in our fund raising drive for the Call Box Restoration project —almost \$11,000 has been raised since the start of the summer. We need another couple thousand more so that the contractor can undertake the basic work of cleaning and painting. The full \$20,000 will ensure that all the boxes have a bronze history plaque and art work relevant to the history, as well as provide funds for future maintenance. We hope to start late fall.

The chosen contractor has already sent a crew to review all the call boxes to determine which ones have parts that are missing, review sizing for the bronze plaques and art work, and deter-



Reservoir Road Traffic: Challenges & How To Help

In recent months, you have most likely been caught in traffic back-ups on Reservoir Road between Foxhall and 37th Street. This congestion is usually the result of traffic flow changes and construction related to one of two projects, Georgetown University road construction and MedStar/GU Hospital Surgical Pavilion construction. (See separate article for updates.)

Over the past year, the Hospital has taken steps to mitigate the congestion, but not all of them have been successful. Representatives from each neighborhood bordering the University meet monthly with Hospital, University and construction officials to review areas of concern and determine possible solutions.

We need the assistance of the greater Foxhall Community members and neighbors to let the construction project manager know when you are personally impacted by the traffic congestion.

Please report construction-related traffic problems, both east and west bound, directly to Matt Maio, Construction Executive for Trammel Crow Company: medstarhospitaltram-mellcrow@gmail.com. Many voices reporting traffic delays and back-ups will have a greater impact than just a couple.

Matt reviews each email complaint and shares it with either MedStar or University staff. Please try to include the date, time and a brief description of the cause of the delay, i.e., cars cannot turn into Entrance #2, construction equipment exiting Entrance #1, etc. And, of course, a cell-phone picture is worth a thousand words!

And as a reminder – If you plan to travel east on Reservoir Road between 8:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. for the foreseeable future, allow extra time!

Major Changes: Entrances from Reservoir Road to the Georgetown Campus

Entrance 4 on Reservoir Road is the westernmost roadway to the Georgetown campus and is the one closest to Foxhall Village. In mid-September, when the new East-West Road opens for vehicular traffic, Entrance 4 will become the primary entrance and exit to the campus from Reservoir Road. In the fall, a sidewalk for pedestrians will be built running from Reservoir Road to Yates Field House. Until then, pedestrians should continue to follow posted signage.

The following is an update as to how all entrances from the north of campus will be used.

Entrance 0. In mid-September, when Entrance 4 opens, Entrance 0 will be permanently closed.

Entrance 1. Throughout the remainder of construction, Entrance 1 off Reservoir Road is closed to cars. Only construction equipment and delivery trucks going to the Hospital's loading dock are permitted to enter or exit via Entrance 1.

Entrance 2. Throughout the remainder of construction, Entrance 2 off Reservoir Road is used for all patient and visitor drop off and parking. Ambulances also use Entrance 2.

Entrance 3. Is only used for employee parking, pick up and/ or drop off.

Entrance 4. In mid-September, when the new two-way East-West Road opens for vehicles, it will connect Reservoir Road to the Leavey Center garage. A permanent traffic signal will be installed at Entrance 4 later this fall. For the initial opening, traffic control officers will be in place to help alleviate congestion on Reservoir Road. In the fall, a sidewalk will also be installed alongside East-West Road.
