**Canal Road Sidewalk Reopened:** The sidewalk between the lower entrance to Glover-Archbald (G-A) Park (where people can access the C&O Canal path) and the Georgetown University (GU) Canal Rd entrance has been reopened, and the shuttle service has been discontinued.

sending to DDOT asking them to consider implementing traffic-calming measures on Reservoir Road near the Lab School campus. The recommendations include installing a speed camera for traffic traveling west from Foxhall Road towards MacArthur Blvd. They also include expanding the school zone area around the Lab School campus and improving the safety of pedestrian crosswalks in the area.

**ANC Roundabout Study Proposal Withdrawn**

At the Oct. 8<sup>th</sup> ANC3D monthly meeting, ANC3D voted 5 to 2 to rescind its plan to hire a consultant to assess the feasibility of constructing a roundabout at the intersection of Foxhall and Reservoir Roads.

**Resolution of the June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024, Pedestrian Death of Patricia Bullinger:**

At the Oct. 8<sup>th</sup> ANC meeting, Commissioner JP Szymkowicz (ANC3D07) presented an update on the criminal case of the driver responsible for the death of our neighbor Patricia Bullinger on June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024. The driver was ultimately charged with failure to give way to a pedestrian, given a 30-day suspended sentence and 90 months of probation and fined \$50.

A cousin of Patricia’s made a moving statement on behalf of herself and her father, who are Patricia’s only surviving relatives. They met with the DC Attorney General and reasons were given as to why this type of offence is not taken on by the US Attorney General. They choose not to be involved in the criminal charging of the driver. The family did engage in the DC Restorative Justice Program, which brings together willing victims and perpetrators to facilitate closure. They felt that the process was successful. She explicitly noted that she and her father understand that Patricia’s tragic death is upsetting for our community, but they hope that the tragedy does not result in further actions against the driver. All attendees at the meeting were very moved by the family’s charity in dealing with this tragedy. As noted, the traffic-calming measures that have been implemented along Foxhall Road were a direct result of Patricia’s death.

**Crime and Public Safety: 2025 Crime Statistics**

While we all would like to live in a world with no crime, the lower-Foxhall-MacArthur neighborhood is fortunate to have had one of the lowest incidences of crime in the District in 2025. Open Data DC lists 24,148 reported crime incidents for the District as a whole in 2025. This includes

1,598 incidents that occurred in Ward 3, and 156 in our ANC (3D).

In Census Tract 8.02, which closely corresponds to our Foxhall-MacArthur neighborhood, 30 crime incidents are reported for all of 2025. Of these, 14 were thefts from autos (don’t leave items of value in plain view). Nine are identified as theft/other, which includes packages stolen by porch pirates. There were 4 vehicles stolen in our neighborhood in 2025 and one burglary.

For the last 3 months of 2025 (since the last printed Foxhall News), Open Data DC reports 9 incidents occurring in our Foxhall-MacArthur neighborhood (See table below). The Oct. 3rd robbery involved several MacArthur High School (MHS) students, who accosted a resident while he was taking video of them most likely smoking pot behind an apartment building in the 4500 block of MacArthur Blvd. The students surrounded the resident and aggressively took the person’s phone.

At the Jan. 7<sup>th</sup> ANC meeting, Officer McElwee discussed a robbery that took place in the evening of Dec. 18<sup>th</sup>, when a MHS student was leaving a basketball game. The student was accosted by several juveniles, who stole a pair of Nike shoes. The police have security footage of the event.



## Remembering Ayveris Christo Andonyadis

Longtime Palisades Village member Ayveris Andonyadis died peacefully in his sleep on Saturday, November 29, 2025. Ayveris was born on January 29, 1928, and educated as an architect in Istanbul, Turkey, where he met and married his wife, Elly. They moved together, first to Athens, Greece, and then to Washington, DC, where Ayveris worked with the Doxiadis Group on architectural and urban redevelopment projects in cities including Philadelphia and Louisville.

A longtime resident of Foxhall Village, he lived in the neighborhood since 1965, where he raised his family, and was active in the community. Ayveris became a US citizen in 1970, the same year that he joined the World Bank, traveling globally and working on education and health-related international development projects across the Middle East and Southeast Asia.

In his retirement, he and Elly enjoyed traveling, experiencing the wonders of architecture and culture on every continent. He considered global travel to be one of the best forms of education and enjoyed little more than exploring the world with good friends and family. Ayveris was devoted to his family, cherishing time with his grandchildren, and celebrated 60 years of marriage with Elly, who pre-deceased him in 2017. In recent years, he has had time to devote to his artistic pursuits, creating pastel drawings. He was a longtime member of the Hellenic Society of Constantinopolitans of Washington, DC, and often led the cutting of the Vasilopita. Ayveris was a regular at Palisades Village events and was known for his fascinating stories of these adventures.

Ayveris is survived by his sister, Elisavi Catovic, his children Nephelie and Christo (Nancy Roche), and his four grandchildren, Leo Korf, Theo, Claire, and Andreas Andonyadis.

Like Howard, Ayveris was a longtime supporter of our community association and regularly attended FCCA General Meetings. We will miss him.

**History: Early Local Governance of the Federal District called Columbia**

The September 2025 Foxhall News “Local History” article discussed the creation of a Federal District called Columbia in 1791. It also discussed the passage by the US Congress of the District of Columbia Organic Act of 1801, which took away the right of the residents of this new district to vote for representatives in Congress and for the president. This act also gave Congress administrative control over the new district; but it did not specify how the area would be governed.

Thus, it was up to the Federal government to determine the local governance of each of the five jurisdictions included in the new federal district: the city of Georgetown, the city of Alexandria, the newly-created City of Washington, and the remaining nonincorporated areas of what were previously part of Maryland (Washington County) and Virginia (Alexandria county), respectively.

**Municipal Governance before 1871**

Prior to 1871, the two existing cities, Georgetown and Alexandria were allowed to continue to operate their existing locally elected municipal governments. In the newly created City of Washington, a mayor was given authority over city services, municipal appointments, and local tax assessments. However, the duties of the mayor mostly consisted of requesting appropriations from Congress to finance the city. From 1802 to 1812, the mayor of Washington City was appointed by the US President. Between 1812 and 1820, the city's mayor was selected by an elected city council, and from 1820 to 1871, the mayor was popularly elected. Both Washington County and Alexandria County operated with boards of commissioners for county-level government functions. Each were governed by levy courts comprised of appointed Justices of the Peace. Between 1791 and 1802, these Justices of the Peace were appointed by the governors of Maryland and Virginia, respectively. From 1802 to 1871, the justices were appointed by the US President. Levy courts functioned like county courts, and included the authority to levy taxes, manage public works, and handle certain legal matters. In the 1840s, some residents of Alexandria County and the City of Alexandria wanted to leave the District because of concerns that the slave trade would be curtailed in the District. In 1848, these areas were returned to Virginia, leaving the District with two independent cities and one county.

**Losing self-governance**

After the Civil War, the population of the District grew at a rapid pace, but local infrastructure remained antiquated; the District still had dirt roads and lacked basic sanitation. In 1800 (just before the passage of the 1801 Organic Act), the population of the entire new federal district was just over 14,000, of which only 227 were free Black people and 3,244 were slaves.

By 1870, the population of the Federal District (which now excluded the parts that had been returned to Virginia) had grown to around 131,700, of which 88,278 were white and 43,404 were Blacks—now all “free Negroes.” Freed slaves had been given the right to vote, which raised concerns in some quarters about how the large Black population would affect the District’s governance. (Note that only men could vote in the District until the passage of the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment in 1919.)

In 1871, Congress passed the District of Columbia Organic Act of 1871 that merged the governments of Washington City, Georgetown City, and rural Washington County into a single municipal government and imposed a territorial form of government with a governor appointed by the President. The primary argument given for the legislation was the need to improve the District’s infrastructure.

### Local Governance in Our Neighborhood

As noted above, Georgetown was allowed to continue its locally elected municipal government until it was absorbed into the District’s single municipality after the passage of the Organic Act of 1871. Prior to this time, Georgetown was governed by a locally elected mayor, a board of aldermen, and a common council. When a customs house was established on Water Street in Georgetown in 1795, General James M. Lingan (who owned the farmland that now comprises our lower Foxhall-MacArthur neighborhood) served as the first Collector of the Port. Henry Foxall (who bought Spring Hill farm—now Foxhall Village--from General Lingan in 1801) was elected as Mayor of Georgetown in 1819 and 1820.

The 1871 Organic Act eliminated Georgetown’s municipal government, and all existing laws and ordinances were formally revoked by Congress effective June 1, 1871. A prominent Georgetown resident, Henry David Cooke, was appointed as the first governor of the District of Columbia, serving from 1871 until 1873. (Henry Cooke, the brother of Civil War profiteer Jay Cooke, was a relatively infamous “friend” of President Ulysses S Grant.) For the next 100 years, Georgetown, as part of the District called Columbia, would remain under direct Federal control.
